The other lab we used for glucose sensor trial was chemistry lab and I felt like an actual engineer who tries their hand made sensor with chemicals to obtain real-time data.



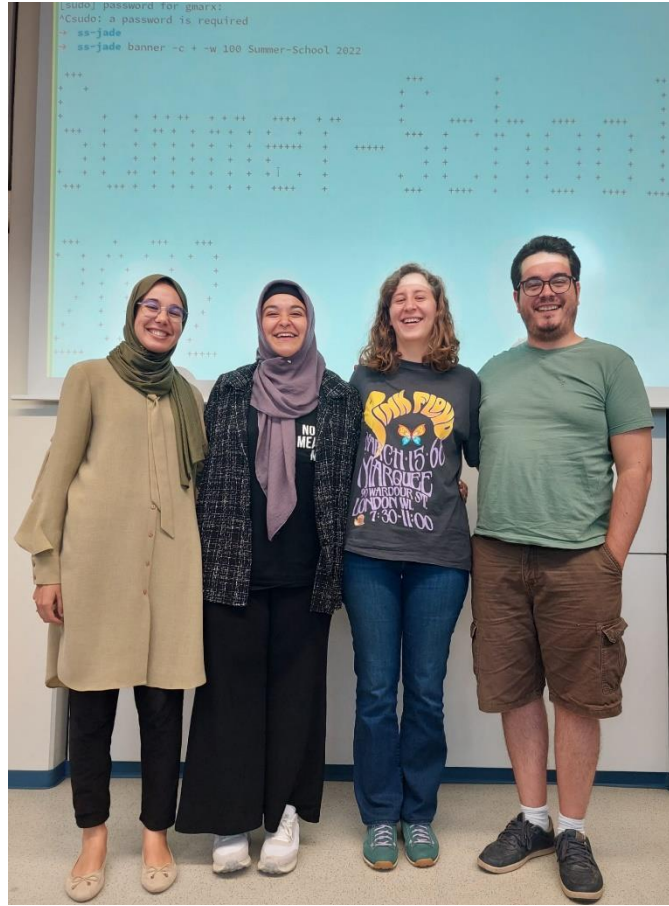
